

# Detailed On-Ice Procedures

Based on the CurlOn return to play guidelines below are the on-ice procedures:

Skip for all teams are responsible to sanitize their own team's rocks. After sanitization you can only touch your own rock.

Instead of a hand shake, give a friendly wave or tap brooms to start the game.

When it is time to go on the ice, sheet 1 and 2 enter at the usual entrance by the kitchen and sheet 3 and 4 will enter from the door closest to front entrance.

## **Sanitize hands at entrance**

Masks may be removed at this time once your 6ft social distance is established and must be maintained, follow on ice spacing markers

Flipping for hammer and colour needs to be done before you go on the ice (using your own coin, Rock-Paper-Scissors or a coin toss app such as "Coin Flip Free").

If you use club equipment (e.g., broom or push stick), you are responsible for sanitizing before you use it.

Players from each team stay on the same side of the sheet. For example, if you are playing on sheet 2, always walk or position yourself on the sideline to sheet 1. This will keep players 10 feet apart.

On ice positioning:

- Two small markings have been placed on the ice, located four feet from each side of centre ice for the non delivering team to stand. See Distancing Illustrations below.
- Non-Delivering Team: The two sweepers of the non-delivering team should be positioned on these markings while the other team is throwing. The player of the non-delivering team whose turn it is next to deliver should be positioned at the hogline on the same side as the two sweepers. The Skip (or Vice-Skip) will stand on the backboards but no closer than the hack.
- Delivering Team: The Skip has control of the house. The player whose turn it is to deliver is in the hack. The non-sweeping player is on the backboards. The sweeping player is at the T-Line. Once the stone has been released, the player who delivered the stone proceeds down the centre line of the ice until the halfway point to the marking or to the hog line if it is their turn next. After the stone comes to rest, the sweeper proceeds to the halfway markings. The non-sweeper travels to the halfway mark or the hog line depending on their turn to deliver or not.
- One sweeper only on all delivered stones. No relaying (second sweeper taking over halfway down the sheet). The person in charge of the house is not allowed to sweep

under any circumstance. The skip of the non-delivering team must remain in the hack area until all stones come to rest. No-one is allowed to sweep an opposition stone behind the tee-line.


- The skip or vice skip (not both) of non-delivering team must stand at the hack until the other team is finished playing and has relinquished control of the house.
- The skip or vice skip (both teams) may not sweep any stones (both colours) set in motion by the delivering team.
- Upon completion of an end only one person per team can move the stones to the backboard. We suggest the two vices move the stones to the backboard (as they are the only two that should be near the house, along with the delivering team sweeper). The stones are only to be touched with your foot or broom.

If you wish to use the scoreboard, numbers should be sanitized before each game by the yellow teams skip (alternatively there are phone apps that can be used such as “Curling Score Keeper”). The yellow teams Vice is to score each game if using the scoreboard.

If you need to measure: remove gloves, sanitize your hands, conduct measure, return measure device to its normal location, sanitize your hands and the measuring stick.
